surveying exotic travel writing in europe from late antiquity to the age of discover the witness and the other world illustrates the fundamental human desire to change places if only in the imagination mary b campbell looks at works by pilgrims crusaders merchants discoverers even armchair fantasists such as mandeville as well as the writings of marco polo columbus and walter raleigh according to campbell these travel accounts are exotic because they bear witness to alienated experiences european travelers while claiming to relate fact were often passing on monstrous projections she contends that their writing not only documented but also made possible the conquest of the peoples whom she travelers described and she shows how travel literature contributed to the genesis of the modern novel and the modern life sciences

ninety years ago knud rasmussen s popular account of his scientific expeditions through greenland and north america introduced readers to the culture and history of arctic natives in the intervening century a robust field of ethnographic research has grown around the inuit and yupiit of north america but until now english language readers have had little access to the broad corpus of work on greenlandic natives worldviews of the greenlanders draws upon extensive danish and greenlandic

unsuccessful to retrieve subterranean objects serve as self referential metaphors for the problems of accessing and retrieving the past they are thus designed to shake the reader's faith in historical representation and highlight the textuality of the historical account. This book, first published in 1990, is a thematic analysis of five tales of early vernacular Chinese literature. Interest in vernacular stories is increasing in the study of Chinese literature as their importance is being recognised as a key part of the oral traditional narrative. From the analysis of the five Chinese tales in light of literary, historical, philological sources and folkloristic methodologies, we may see to what extent tales of an intrinsically religious nature can offer meanings in the oral tradition.
