one of the most influential works of this century the myth of sisyphus and other essays is a crucial exposition of existentialist thought influenced by works such as don juan and the novels of kafka these essays begin with a meditation on suicide the question of living or not living in a universe devoid of order or meaning with lyric eloquence albert camus brilliantly posits a way out of despair reaffirming the value of personal existence and the possibility of life lived with dignity and authenticity

the one and only original teenage diary at thirteen years old adrian mole has more than his fair share of problems spots ill health parents threatening to divorce rejection of his poetry and much more all recorded with brilliant humour in his diary antonin artaud s novelised biography of the 3rd century roman emperor heliogabalus is simultaneously his most accessible and his most extreme book written in 1933 at the time when artaud was preparing to stage his legendary theatre of cruelty heliogabalus is a powerful concoction of sexual excess self deification and terminal violence translated by alexis lykiard acclaimed translator of lautreamont s maldoror and with an introduction by stephen barber author of artaud blows bombs artaud the screaming body and caligula divine carnage

this is the autobiography of abdul salam zaeef a senior former member of the taliban his memoirs translated from pashto are more than just a personal account of his extraordinary life my life with the taliban offers a counter narrative to the standard accounts of afghanistan since 1979 zaeef describes growing up in rural poverty in kandahar province both of his parents died at an early age and the russian invasion of 1979 forced him to flee to pakistan he started fighting the jihad in 1983 during which time he was associated with many major figures in the anti soviet resistance including the current taliban head mullah mohammad omar after the war zaeef returned to a quiet life in a small village in kandahar but chaos soon overwhelmed afghanistan as factional fighting erupted after the russians pulled out disgusted by the lawlessness that ensued zaeef was one among the former mujahidin who were closely involved in the discussions that led to the emergence of the taliban in 1994 zaeef then details his taliban career as civil servant and minister who negotiated with foreign oil companies as well as with afghanistan s own resistance leader ahmed shah massoud zaeef was ambassador to pakistan at the time of the 9 11 attacks and his account discusses the strange phoney war period before the us led intervention toppled the taliban in early 2002 zaeef was handed over to american forces in pakistan notwithstanding his diplomatic status and spent four and a half years in prison including several years in guantanamo before being released without having been tried or charged with any offence my life with the taliban offers a personal and privileged insight into the rural pashtun village communities that are the

taliban s bedrock it helps to explain what drives men like zaeef to take up arms against the foreigners who are foolish enough to invade his homeland

a world class thinker counts the 100 ways in which humans behave irrationally showing us what we can do to recognize and minimize these thinking errors to make better decisions and have a better life despite the best of intentions humans are notoriously bad that is irrational when it comes to making decisions and assessing risks and tradeoffs psychologists and neuroscientists refer to these distinctly human foibles biases and thinking traps as cognitive errors cognitive errors are systematic deviances from rationality from optimized logical rational thinking and behavior we make these errors all the time in all sorts of situations for problems big and small whether to choose the apple or the cupcake whether to keep retirement funds in the stock market when the dow tanks or whether to take the advice of a friend over a stranger the behavioral turn in neuroscience and economics in the past twenty years has increased our understanding of how we think and how we make decisions it shows how systematic errors mar our thinking and under which conditions our thought processes work best and worst evolutionary psychology delivers convincing theories about why our thinking is in fact marred the neurosciences can pinpoint with increasing precision what exactly happens when we think clearly and when we don't drawing on this wide body of research the art of thinking clearly is an entertaining presentation of these known systematic thinking errors offering guidance and insight into everything why you shouldn t accept a free drink to why you should walk out of a movie you don t like it to why it s so hard to predict the future to why shouldn t watch the news the book is organized into 100 short chapters each covering a single cognitive error bias or heuristic examples of these concepts include reciprocity confirmation bias the it gets better before it gets worse trap and the man with a hammer tendency in engaging prose and with real world examples and anecdotes the art of thinking clearly

helps solve the puzzle of human reasoning
