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comedy and humour have frequently played a key role in disabled people's lives for better or for worse comedy has also played a crucial part in constructing cultural representations of disability and impairments contributing to the formation and maintenance of cultural attitudes towards disabled people and potentially shaping disabled people's images of themselves as a complex and often polysemic form of communication there is a need for greater understanding of the way we make meanings from comedy this is the first book which explores the specific role of comedic film genres in representations of disability and impairment wilde argues that there is a need to explore different ways to synthesise critical disability studies with film studies approaches and that a better understanding of genre conventions is necessary if we are to understand the conditions of possibility for new representational forms and challenges to ableism after a discussion of the possibilities of a fusion between disability studies and film studies and a consideration of the relationships of comedy to disability wilde undertakes analysis of contemporary films from the romantic comedy satire and gross out genres analysis is focused upon the place of disabled and non disabled people in particular films considering visual audio and narrative dimensions of representation and the ways they might shape the expectations of film audiences this book is of particular value to those in film and media studies and critical disability studies especially for those who are investigating more inclusive practices in cultural representation

this book helps readers understand moonlight's profound political and social importance the innovative technical choices adopted by director barry jenkins and the film's adoption and disruption of traditional coming of age themes through the specific prism of chiron's childhood and youth moonlight 2016 is an intensely moving and poetically rendered coming of age story about a young gay black boy chiron highly praised by both critics and audiences internationally it garnered a surprise best picture win at the 2017 academy awards enshrining its significance within a global cinematic canon this book provides an account of how moonlight can be situated in relation to african american youth films contemporary queer cinema and its appeal to the youth market and representations of non normative childhood and adolescence it analyses the reception of moonlight in terms of its form and profound emotional impact on spectators offering new visions of african american boyhoods while also contributing an extended exploration of the social and political context of the film in relation to obama trump and diversity in filmmaking highlighting to students and scholars the powerful emotional pull of moonlight and why it is a highly significant film this book is ideal for those interested in critical race studies queer theory youth cinema african american cinema and lgbtq cinema

invisible digital helps us makes sense of something we cannot see by presenting an innovative approach to digital images and digital culture at its heart is a novel method for exploring software used in the creation of moving images as markers of converging cultural organizational and technological influences the three main case studies of invisible digital are the animated feature moana 2016 and the computer games no man's sky 2016 and everything 2017 all three were created using procedural techniques simulation software for moana and procedural content generation for no man's sky and everything production culture disclosures associated with procedural techniques often emphasize the influences of automated systems and their algorithms making them ideal for a study that interrogates digital processes the approach of invisible digital is informed by relational theories and the concept of entanglement based on materialist perspectives combined with insights from work that more explicitly interrogates algorithms and algorithmic culture aylish wood employs the notion of assemblages to introduce the concept of material cultural narratives using this conceptual framework she draws out material cultural narratives for each case study to demonstrate what they reveal about software and digital culture these analyses of software provide a widely applicable method through which moving image studies can contribute more fully to the wider and growing debates about algorithmic culture

when the first fast furious film was released in june 2001 few predicted that it would be a box office hit let alone the launchpad for a multi billion dollar franchise a mid budget crime movie set around l a s underground car racing scene featuring a cast of relative unknowns the film became one of the surprise hits of that summer earning more than 5 times its budget in worldwide ticket sales 2 decades and 9 films later fast furious today ranks among the 10 highest grossing movie franchises of all time with a box office total of 6.6 billion and has also given rise to an animated tv show and theme park ride full throttle franchise is the first book to offer an in depth analysis of the fast furious bringing together a range of scholars to explore not only the style and themes of the franchise but also its broader cultural impact and legacy the collected essays establish the franchise s importance in cinematic and ideological terms linking their discussions to wider issues of genre representation adaptation and industry topics range from stardom and performance focusing on key actors vin diesel and dwayne johnson to the way in which fast furious intersects with dominant ideas of racial gender and sexual identity aimed at both scholars and fans full throttle franchise seeks to uncover just what has made fast furious so enduringly popular mapping its outrageous set pieces ever expanding universe and growing cast of global megastars in terms of wider cultural and industrial forces

this book explores the impact of digital technology on the essay film in the early 21st century arguing that the cinematic essay has been associated with technological evolution throughout its history the author considers the output of four towering figures in essay filmmaking harun farocki chris marker chantal akerman and jean luc godard and explores the ways in which these directors utilise aesthetic strategies editing techniques and modes of spectatorial address that are rooted in the capabilities of digital technologies slaymaker conceptualises the cinematic essay as a self reflexive mode of nonfiction cinema one that foregrounds the filmmaking apparatus and the act of its own making and which thereby launches an inquiry into the ontological nature of the cinematic image the tools which construct it and the wider artistic landscape in which it is embedded

activities of pbs hbo or sundance it considers the movement of filmmakers between indie film and tv such as steven soderbergh rian johnson the duplass brothers joe swanberg lynn shelton and gregg araki details the confluence of aesthetic and thematic elements seen in shows such as girls breaking bad master of none or glow points to a shared interest in regional sensibilities evident in shows like one mississippi or fargo and makes the case for documentaries and web series as significant entities in this domain collectively the book builds a compelling picture of indie tv as a significant feature of us screen entertainment in the 21st century this interdisciplinary landmark volume will be a go to reference for students and scholars of television studies film studies and media studies

the negro motorist green book was a groundbreaking guide that provided african american travelers with crucial information on safe places to stay eat and visit during the era of segregation in the united states this essential resource originally published from 1936 to 1966 offered a lifeline to black motorists navigating a deeply divided nation helping them avoid the dangers and indignities of racism on the road more than just a travel guide the negro motorist green book stands as a powerful symbol of resilience and resistance in the face of oppression offering a poignant glimpse into the challenges and triumphs of the african american experience in the 20th century

prolific imagery that this theme stimulates can be positive and inspiring the lost child complex in australian film is a unique and compelling work which will be highly relevant for academics and students of jungian and post jungian ideas cultural studies screen and media studies it will also appeal to jungian psychotherapists and analytical psychologists as well as readers with a broader interest in australian history and politics

the science fiction film in contemporary hollywood focuses on the american science fiction sf film during the period 2001 2020 in order to provide a theoretical mapping of the genre in the context of conglomerate hollywood using a social semiotics approach in a systematic corpus of films the book argues that the sf film can be delineated by two semiotic squares the first one centering on the genre s more than human ontologies sf bodies and the second one focusing on its imaginative worlds sf worlds based on this theoretical framework the book examines the genre in six cycles which are placed in their historical context and are analyzed in relation to cultural discourses such as technological embodiment race animal human relations environmentalism global capitalism and the techno scientific empire by considering these cycles which include superhero films creature films space operas among others as expressions of the genre s basic oppositions the book facilitates the comparison and juxtaposition of films that have rarely been discussed in tandem offering a new perspective on the multiple articulations of the sf film in the new millennium
