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realistic representation of the speech of the lower classes in ancient literature is largely confined to the comic genres and petronius realism in this area is more thorough going than that of any other ancient author a vast scholarly literature has grown up around the question of how faithfully the speeches of petronius freedmen reflect characteristics of actual popular speech this literature is reviewed and evaluated a survey of the phonological morphological lexical and syntactic peculiarities in these speeches is then undertaken in which they are compared with other vulgar latin sources such as the pompeian inscriptions petronius is in fact one of our most important early sources for the study of popular latin the way in which petronius used specific varieties of non standard latin to characterize different freedmen speakers is explored petronius has subtly modulated his freedmen's speeches to reflect differing emotional states and the different attitudes of the speakers toward their social position the present study is the first comprehensive treatment of the subject undertaken in over forty years in any language and the only one in english

this work inquires into the impact of dissident sensibilities on the writings of the major neronian authors it offers a detailed and innovative analysis of essays poetry and fiction written by seneca lucan and petronius and illuminates their psychological and moral anguish the study is intended as a companion volume to vasily rudich's earlier work political dissidence under nero the price of dissimulation where he discussed the ways in which dissident sensibilities of the neronians affected their actual behaviour dissidence and literature under nero extends this analysis to show how the same sensibilities became manifest in the texts written by the neronian authors it explores the pressures on authors under a repressive regime who strive to maintain their artistic integrity thus the argument

of this book can be seen as a comparison between the predicament of a neronian dissident and the situation of the postmodern intellectual it will interest professional classicists and the wider audience concerned with the ongoing debate on the benefits and perils of rhetorical discourse

few surviving works of classical literature have cast the haunting hilarious insightful and eerie spell conjured by the satyricon of the neronian courtier and eventual victim petronius fragmentary opaque and enigmatic at times it seems that deception and obfuscation are the favorite tricks of its author a reading of petronius satyricon offers a fresh look at this genre defying masterpiece proceeding episode by episode and scene by scene through a vision of the hell that humanity has fashioned for itself petronius mercilessly and exactingly appraises rome s embrace of the golden age dreams of the augustan principate judging his fellow citizens and himself by the yardstick of the neronian reign that broods over them like an avenging specter petronius satyricon offers medicine for ambulatory corpses a prescription that consists of notifying the dead of the diagnosis and of pointing out the inevitable and eminently logical antidote for those consumed by insatiable hunger and unfulfillable longing bitterly sardonic and preternaturally serene lee fratantuono s reading reveals petronius to be nothing less than the ultimate literary voice of a dying dynasty a prose and poetic verbal magician of serious intention a virtuoso in the art of unmasking the ghoulish horror and inconsolable sadness that lurk often just below the surface of the comic

ambiguity in the sense of two or more possible meanings is considered to be a distinctive feature of modern art and literature it characterizes the open artwork eco and is generated by disruptive tactics wellershoff and strategies to engender uncertainty while ambiguity is seen as a paradigm of modernity bode there is skepticism regarding its use in the pre modern era older studies were dominated by the conviction that there was a lack of ambiguity in pre modernity because according to the rules of the old rhetoric ambiguity was seen as an avoidable error vitium and a violation of the dictate of clarity perspicuitas the aim of the volume is to re examine the putative absence of ambiguity in the pre modern era is it not possible to find clear examples of deliberately employed intended ambiguity in antiquity are the oracles and riddles the palinode of stesichoros and socrates phaedrus the dissoi logoi of rhetoric the ambiguities of the tragedies all exceptions or do they not indicate a distinct interest in the artistic use of ambiguity the presentations of the conference which will include scholars from various philologies will combine a recourse to theoretical concepts of intended ambiguity with exemplary analyses from the field of pre modern art and literature

those articles in the collection which concern petronius satyrica include a general interpretation of this fragmentary and problematic text an exploration of its narrative technique its relationship to menippean satire and to recently discovered greek novel papyri and the issue of its realism book jacket on apuleius

metamorphoses the collection includes pieces on narrative and ideological unity an exploration of its narrative technique its relationship to religion and platonism to epic and to the greek ass stories and to historical realism jacket

this companion addresses a topic of continuing contemporary relevance both cultural and literary offers both a wide ranging exploration of the classical novel of antiquity and a wealth of close literary analysis brings together the most up to date international scholarship on the ancient novel including fresh new academic voices includes focused chapters on individual classical authors such as petronius xenophon and apuleius as well as a wide ranging thematic analysis addresses perplexing questions concerning authorial expression and readership of the ancient novel form provides an accomplished introduction to a genre with a rising profile

this thematic fourth supplementum to ancient narrative entitled metaphor and the ancient novel is a collection of revised versions of papers originally read at the second rethymnon international conference on the ancient novel rican 2 under the same title held at the university of crete rethymnon on may 19 20 2003 though research into metaphor has reached staggering proportions over the past twenty five years this is the first volume dedicated entirely to the subject of metaphor in relation to the ancient novel not every contributor takes into account theoretical discussions of metaphor but the usefulness of every single paper lies in the fact that they explore actual texts while sometimes theorists tend to work out of context

the greek and roman novels can be seen as an important transitional moment in the trajectory from performance to reading from oralism to textuality that has underpinned the history of discourse in european consciousness since the 5th century bc in different and intriguing ways they explore the contrast tension conflict competition or dialogue between modes of discourse which frame the novel s concern with identity and self fashioning as well as advertising innovation more generally this volume brings together an international group of scholars interested in ancient and modern constructions of orality and writing and how they are reflected and manipulated in the ancient novel the essays deal not only with questions of genre oral poetics and traditions but also with how various ways of pitting or collapsing modes of representation can become loaded articulations of wider world views of cultural literary epistemological anxieties and aspirations the contributors focus in particular on issues surrounding theatricality gender identity rhetorical performance epistolarity monumentality and power in the ancient novel

the present volume contains revised versions of most of the papers that were delivered at rican 7 which was held in rethymnon crete on 27 28 may 2013 the focus of the conference was on the portrayal and function of male and female slaves and their masters mistresses in the ancient novel and related texts the complex relationship between these social categories raises questions about slavery and freedom gender and identity stability of the self and social mobility social control and social death the papers offer a wide and rich range of perspectives enslavement of elite women in chariton s callirhoe and stoic ideas of moral slavery in dio chrysostom hilton reversal of social status and techniques of self characterization in chariton de temmerman the interaction between implicit and explicit narratives of slavery in chariton and its effect on the readers of the

novel owes the narratological structural and symbolic centrality of slavery in Xenophon's *Ephesiaka* or *Trzaskoma* the socio historical dimensions of slavery and the prominent discourse on despotism in Iamblichus' *Babylonika* or *Dowden* the balance between historical accuracy and fiction in the representation of slavery in Achilles Tatius' *Billault* animals, human slaves and elite masters and the presence of Rome in Longus' *Daphnis* and Chloe Bowie the distribution of slaves on the geographical, cultural and moral maps drawn in Heliodorus' *Aithiopika* or Montiglio slave women and their relationships to their mistresses as positive and negative paradigms of love in Heliodorus' *Aithiopika* Morgan and Repath the freedman's world as a self-perpetuating and closed universe in Petronius' *Satyrica* or Bodel beauty, slavery and the destabilization of societal norms and authority figures in Petronius' *Satyrica* Panayotakis the interaction between Roman comedy and elegy in the representation of the relationship of Lucius and Photis in Apuleius' *Metamorphoses* may a comparative analysis of the semantics and function of slavery related terms in pseudo Lucian's *Onos* and Apuleius' *Metamorphoses* Paschalis enslaved and free storytelling in the life of Aesop and the history and evolution of the ancient fable tradition Lefkowitz

the deciphering the e book includes a selection from the over three hundred anagrammed sentences all marked vinci which in the book reconstruct the story of the sforzas in the year 1495 when duke gian galeazzo was poisoned and the ducal title usurped by moro this preview is a surprising chapter of the research where the inscription iaco bar vigennis p1495 the keyword musca is a sort of arcane narrative matrix which generates anagrams that strictly respect the scientific criteria of repeatability and reproducibility

From Celsius to Fahrenheit: Understanding the Conversion of 102°C

Temperature is a fundamental aspect of our daily lives, influencing everything from our comfort level to the success of cooking and scientific experiments.
