exercise tiger a series of operations off the south devon coast in the spring of 1944 rehearsing for the forthcoming d day landings shrouded in mystery one of these exercises ended in disaster for over 600 young american servicemen as their operation was discovered by a patrol of german e boats which attacked leaving two lsts sunk and one badly damaged the secret nature of these exercises some claimed led to a military cover up and many families were not immediately informed of the nature of the deaths of their loved ones over the months that followed d day came and went the war ended and there seemed little point in raking over this sorry affair exercise tiger became a forgotten chapter in the annals of the second world war using archive documents and images this book recounts the history and personal accounts behind this tragic event as well as examining the many subsequent conspiracy theories and exploring the evidence behind them illustrations 75 black and white photographs

this volume combines some of the leading voices on the composition and collection of early christian gospels in order to analyze tatian s diatessaron the rapid rise and sudden suppression of the diatessaron has raised numerous questions about the nature and intent of this second century composition it has been claimed as both a vindication of the fourfold gospel s early canonical status and as an argument for the canon s on going fluidity it has been touted as both a premiere witness to the earliest recoverable gospel text and as an early corrupting influence on that text collectively these essays provide the greatest advance in diatessaronic scholarship in a quarter of a century the contributors explore numerous questions did tatian intend to supplement or supplant the fourfold gospel how many were his sources and how free was he with their text how do we identify a diatessaronic witness is it legitimate to use tatian s diatessaron as a source in new testament textual criticism is a reconstruction of the diatessaron still possible these queries in turn contribute to the question of what the diatessaron signifies with respect to the broader context of gospel writing and what this can tell us about how the writing rewriting and reception of gospel material functioned in the first and second centuries and beyond

comic writing to the careful modulations of the most significant sermons of the age and from the pithy and concise english essays of francis bacon to the ornate and meandering style of john florio s translation of montaigne s famous collection each essay provides an overview as well as comment on key passages and a select guide to further reading

the powerful german battlecruiser scharnhorst was stalked and engaged on 26 december 1943 by a superior allied naval task force off the north cape of norway in pitch darkness and mountainous seas british warships led by hms duke of york and hms belfast engaged the scharnhorst in a clash of the titans that saw the pride of the german navy sent to the bottom of the barents sea of the 1 972 men on board only 36 were saved it was the last battle to be fought in the atlantic between capital ships in 2000 the norwegian writer and investigative journalist alf r jacobsen led the expedition that found and filmed the wreck of the scharnhorst 300 metres down in the freezing ocean inside the arctic circle in scharnhorst he brings together the compelling story of this important naval engagement and his personal account of how he finally succeeded in locating and filming the wreck of the ill fated battlecruiser

in this classic study alan brudner investigates the basic structure of the common law of transactions for decades that structure has been the subject of intense debate between formalists who say that transactional law is a private law for interacting parties and functionalists who say that it is a public law serving the collective ends of society against both camps brudner proposes a synthesis of formalism and functionalism in which private law is modified by a common good without being subservient to it drawing on hegel s legal philosophy the author exhibits this synthesis in each of transactional law s main divisions property contract unjust enrichment and tort each is a whole composed of private law and public law parts that complement each other and the idea connecting the parts to each other is also latently present in each moreover brudner argues a single narrative thread connects the divisions of transactional law to each other not a row of disconnected fields transactional law is rather a story about the

realization in law of the agent's claim to be a dignified end master of its body its acquisitions and the shape of its life transactional law's divisions are stages in the progress toward that goal each generating a potential developed by the next thus contract law fulfils what is incompletely realized in property law negligence law what is germinal in contract law public insurance what is seminal in negligence law and transactional law as a whole what is underdeveloped in public insurance the end point is the limit of what a transactional law can contribute to a life sufficient for dignity reconfigured and expanded with a contribution by jennifer nadler the unity of the common law stands out among contemporary theories of private law in that it depicts private law as purposive without being instrumental and as autonomous without being empty formal
