a dramatic account of life in czechoslovakia s great capital during the nazi protectorate with this successor book to prague in black and gold his account of more than a thousand years of central european history the great scholar peter demetz focuses on just six short years a tormented tragic and unforgettable time he was living in prague then a first degree half jew according to the nazis terrible categories and here he joins his objective chronicle of the city under german occupation with his personal memories of that period from the bitter morning of march 15 1939 when hitler arrived from berlin to set his seal on the nazi takeover of the czechoslovak government until the liberation of bohemia in april 1945 after long seasons of unimaginable suffering and pain demetz expertly interweaves a superb account of the german authorities diplomatic financial and military machinations with a brilliant description of prague s evolving resistance and underground opposition along with his private experiences he offers the heretofore untold history of an effervescent unstoppable prague whose urbane heart went on beating despite the deportations murders cruelties and violence a prague that kept its german and czech language theaters open its fabled film studios functioning its young people in school and at work and its newspapers on press this complex continually surprising book is filled with rare human detail and warmth the gripping story of a great city meeting the dual challenge of occupation and of war

in september 1938 the munich agreement delivered the sudetenland to germany six months later hitler s troops

marched unopposed into prague and established the protectorate of bohemia and moravia the first non german territory to be occupied by nazi germany although czechs outnumbered germans thirty to one nazi leaders were determined to make the region entirely german chad bryant explores the origins and implementation of these plans as part of a wider history of nazi rule and its consequences for the region to make the protectorate german half the czech population and all jews would be expelled or killed with the other half assimilated into a german national community with the correct racial and cultural composition with the arrival of reinhard heydrich germanization measures accelerated people faced mounting pressure from all sides the nazis required their subjects to act and speak german while czech patriots and exiled leaders pressed their countrymen to act as good czechs by destroying democratic institutions harnessing the economy redefining citizenship murdering the jews and creating a climate of terror the nazi occupation set the stage for the postwar expulsion of czechoslovakia s three million germans and for the communists rise to power in 1948 the region bryant shows became entirely czech but not before nazi rulers and their postwar successors had changed forever what it meant to be czech or german

prior to hitler s occupation nearly 120 000 jews inhabited the areas that would become the protectorate of bohemia and moravia by 1945 all but a handful had either escaped or been deported and murdered by the nazis this pioneering study gives a definitive account of the holocaust as it was carried out in the region detailing the german and czech policies including previously overlooked measures such as small town ghettoization and forced labor that shaped jewish life drawing on extensive new evidence wolf gruner demonstrates how the persecution of the jews as well as their reactions and resistance efforts were the result of complex actions by german authorities in prague and berlin as well as the czech government and local authorities

the phenomenon of national identities always a key issue in the modern history of bohemian jewry was particularly complex because of the marginal differences that existed between the available choices considerable overlap was evident in the programs of the various national movements and it was possible to change one s national identity or even to opt for more than one such identity without necessarily experiencing any far reaching consequences in everyday life based on many hitherto unknown archival sources from the czech republic israel and austria the author s research reveals the inner dynamic of each of the national movements and maps out the three most important constructions of national identity within bohemian jewry the german jewish the czech jewish and the Zionist this book

provides a needed framework for understanding the rich history of german and czech jewish politics and culture in bohemia and is a notable contribution to the historiography of bohemian czechoslovak and central european jewry

franz kafka is by far the prague author most widely read and admired internationally however his reception in czechoslovakia launched by the liblice conference in 1963 has been conflicted while rescuing kafka from years of censorship and neglect czech critics of the 1960s overwrote his german and jewish literary and cultural contexts in order to focus on his czech cultural connections seeking to rediscover kafka s multiple backgrounds in franz kafka and his prague contexts marek nekula focuses on kafka s jewish social and literary networks in prague his german and czech bilingualism and his knowledge of yiddish and hebrew kafka s bilingualism is discussed in the context of contemporary essentialist views of a writer s organic language and identity nekula also pays particular attention to kafka s education examining his studies of czech language and literature as well as its role in his intellectual life the book concludes by asking how kafka read his urban environment looking at the readings of prague encoded in his fictional and nonfictional texts nekula s work has had a major impact on our understanding of kafka s relation to the complex social cultural and linguistic environment of early twentieth century prague while little of this work has been available in english until now the present volume translates many of his most important studies and includes revisions and expansions appearing now for the first time nekula challenges stubborn clichés and opens important

the myriad debates on restitution and memory which have been going on in europe for decades indicate that world war ii never ended it is still very much with us paradoxically re invoked by the events of 1989 90 and the expansion of europe to the east in the aftermath of the collapse of communism and economic globalization the growing privatization and reprivatization in eastern europe revive pre war memories that lay buried under the blanket of collectivization and nationalization of property after 1945 world war ii did not only result in the death and destruction on a large scale but also in an a far reaching revolution of existing property relations this volume offers an assessment of the problematic of restitution and its close interconnection with the discourses of memory that have recently emerged

in august 1938 george f kennan was assigned as secretary of legation in prague after the germans occupied czechoslovakia in march 1939 he stayed on in that country when most other western observers had left these diplomatic papers letters and notes are on the spot observations by a skilled and sensitive historian and diplomat

vietnamese blogger none of them is famous but their lives are revealing they speak to tensions between exclusionary nationalism and on the ground diversity in their struggles against alienation and dislocation they forged alternative communities in cafes workplaces and online while strolling park paths joining political marches or writing about their lives these outsiders came to embody a city that on its surface was built for others a powerful and creative meditation on place and nation the individual and community prague envisions how cohesion and difference might coexist as it acknowledges a need common to all

for many centuries prague has exerted a particular fascination because of its beauty and therichness of its culture and history its famous group of german and czech writers of mostly jewish extraction in the earlier part of this century has deeply influenced western culture however little attention has so far been paid to the roles of women in the history of this ethnically diverse area in around prague based on largely autobiographical writings and letters by women and enhanced by extensive historical introduction this book redresses a serious imbalance the vivid and often moving portraits which emerge from the varied material used by the author offer fascinating and new insights into the social and cultural history of this region

the german speaking inhabitants of the bohemian capital developed a group identification and defined themselves as a minority as they dealt with growing czech political and economic strength in the city and with their own sharp numerical decline in the 1910 census only seven percent of the metropolitan population claimed that they spoke primarily german the study uses census returns extensive police and bureaucratic records newspaper accounts and memoirs on local social and political life to show how the german minority and the czech majority developed demographically and economically in relation to each other and created separate social and political lives for their group members the study carefully traces the roles of occupation class religion and political ideology in the formation of german group loyalties and social solidarities

a finely drawn portrait of einstein's sixteen months in prague in the spring of 1911 albert einstein moved with his wife and two sons to prague the capital of bohemia where he accepted a post as a professor of theoretical physics though he intended to make prague his home he lived there for just sixteen months an interlude that his biographies typically dismiss as a brief and inconsequential episode einstein in bohemia is a spellbinding portrait of the city that touched einstein's life in unexpected ways and of the gifted young scientist who left his mark on the science literature

vaclav hou vi ka describes the development of the czech german national controversies from the mid 19th century through the establishing of the czechoslovakrepublic in 1918 to the beginning of the 21st century he focuses mainly on the tragic end of the nations coexistence in 1938 1945 and the following development of different czech and german reflections on the reasons for the removal of germans from the czechoslovakrepublic after 1945 in the latter part of the 20th century a detailed explanation of czech german and sudeten german concepts is rendered in detail and coherently within the international and social economic context of the 20th century

originally published in 1938 this early work by english historian elizabeth wiskemann is both expensive and hard to find in its first edition it contains details on the findings of her study into the lives of germans living in czechoslovakia during the early twentieth century this is a fascinating work and thoroughly recommended for anyone interested in european history many of the earliest books particularly those dating back to the 1900s and before are now extremely scarce we are republishing these classic works in affordable high quality modern editions using the original text and artwork

terezín as it was known in czech or theresienstadt as it was known in german was operated by the nazis between november 1941 and may 1945 as a transit ghetto for central and western european jews before their deportation for

murder in the east terezín was the last ghetto to be liberated one day after the end of world war ii the last ghetto is the first in depth analytical history of a prison society during the holocaust rather than depict the prison society which existed within the ghetto as an exceptional one unique in kind and not understandable by normal analytical methods anna hájková argues that such prison societies that developed during the holocaust are best understood as simply other instances of the societies human beings create under normal circumstances challenging conventional claims of holocaust exceptionalism hájková insists instead that we ought to view the holocaust with the same analytical tools as other historical events the prison society of terezín produced its own social hierarchies under which seemingly small differences among prisoners of age ethnicity or previous occupation could determine whether one ultimately lived or died during the three and a half years of the camp s existence prisoners created their own culture and habits bonded fell in love and forged new families based on extensive archival research in nine languages and on empathetic reading of victim testimonies the last ghetto is a transnational cultural social gender and organizational history of terezín revealing how human society works in extremis and highlighting the key issues of responsibility agency and its boundaries and belonging

bohemia and moravia today part of the czech republic was the first territory with a majority of non german speakers occupied by hitler s third reich on the eve of the world war ii tens of thousands of jewish inhabitants in the so called protectorate of bohemia and moravia soon felt the tragic consequences of nazi racial politics not all czechs however remained passive bystanders during the genocide after the destruction of czechoslovakia in 1938 39 slovakia became a formally independent but fully subordinate satellite of germany despite the fact it was not occupied until 1944 slovakia paid germany to deport its own jewish citizens to extermination camps about 270 000 out of the 360 000 czech and slovak casualties of world war ii were victims of the holocaust despite these statistics the holocaust vanished almost entirely from post war czechoslovak and later czech and slovak historical cultures the communist dictatorship carried the main responsibility for this disappearance yet the situation has not changed much since the fall of the communist regime the main questions of this study are how and why the holocaust was excluded from the czech and slovak history
