from the gibson girl to the flapper from the vamp to the new woman carolyn kitch traces mass media images of women to their historical roots on magazine covers unveiling the origins of gender stereotypes in early twentieth century american culture kitch examines the years from 1895 to 1930 as a time when the first wave of feminism intersected with the rise of new technologies and media for the reproduction and dissemination of visual images access to suffrage higher education the professions and contraception broadened women s opportunities but the images found on magazine covers emphasized the role of women as consumers suffrage was reduced to spending sexuality to sexiness and a collective women s movement to individual choices of personal style in the 1920s kitch argues the political prominence of the new woman dissipated but her visual image pervaded print media with seventy five photographs of cover art by the era s most popular illustrators the girl on the magazine cover shows how these images created a visual vocabulary for understanding femininity and masculinity as well as class status through this iconic process magazines helped set cultural norms for women for men and for what it meant to be an american kitch contends

revolutionary memory is the most important book yet to be published about the vital tradition of leftwing american poetry as cary nelson shows it is not only our image of the past but also our sense of the present and future that changes when we recover these revolutionary memories making a forceful case for political poetry as poetry nelson brings to bear his extraordinary knowledge of american poets radical movements and social struggles in order to bring out an undervalued strength in a literature often left at the canon s edge focused in part of the red decade of the 1930s revolutionary memory revitalizes biographical criticism for writers on the margin and shows us for the first time how progressive poets fused their work into a powerful chorus of political voices richly detailed and beautifully illustrated with period engravings and woodcuts revolutionary memory brings that chorus dramatically to life and set a cultural agenda for future work

in the late nineteenth and early twentieth century ideals of technological progress and mass consumerism shaped the print cultures of countries across the globe magazines in europe the usa latin america and asia inflected a shared internationalism and technological optimism but there were equally powerful countervailing influences of patriotic or insurgent nationalism and of traditionalism that promoted cultural differentiation in their editorials images and advertisements magazines embodied the tensions between these domestic imperatives and the forces of global modernity magazines and modern identities explores how these tensions played out in the magazine cultures of ten different countries describing how publications drew on resisted and informed the ideals and visual forms of global modernism chapters take in the magazines of australia europe and north america as well as china the soviet turkic states and mexico with contributions from leading international scholars the book considers the pioneering developments in european and north american periodicals in the modernist period whilst expanding the field of enquiry to take in the vibrant magazine cultures of east asia and latin america the construction of these magazines modern ideals was a complex dialectical process in dialogue with international modernism but equally responsive to their local cultures and the beliefs and expectations of their readers magazines and modern identities captures the diversity of these ideals in periodicals that both embraced and criticised the globalised culture of the technological era

honorable mention latin american studies association mexico section best book in the humanities a revolution in movement is the first book to illuminate how collaborations between dancers and painters shaped mexico s postrevolutionary cultural identity k mitchell snow traces this relationship throughout nearly half a century of developments in mexican dance the emulation of diaghilev s ballets russes in the 1920s the adoption of u s style modern dance in the 1940s and the creation of ballet inspired folk dance in the 1960s snow describes the appearances in mexico by russian ballerina anna pavlova and spanish concert dancer tort la valencia who helped motivate mexico to express its own national identity through dance he discusses the work of muralists and other visual artists in tandem with mexico s theatrical dance world including diego rivera s collaborations with ballet composer carlos ch vez carlos m rida s leadership of the national school of dance jos clemente orozco s involvement in the creation of the ballet de la ciudad de m xico and miguel covarrubias who led the golden age of mexican modern dance snow draws from a rich trove of historical newspaper accounts and other contemporary documents to show how these collaborations produced an image of modern mexico that would prove popular both locally and internationally and continues to endure today

since the magazine s first issue in 1964 teenset s role in popular music journalism has been overlooked and underappreciated teen fan magazines often written by women and assumed to be read only by young girls have been misconstrued by scholars and journalists to lack seriousness in their coverage of popular music teenset teen fan magazines and rock journalism don t let the name fool you disputes the prevailing conception that teen fan magazines are insignificant and elevates the publications to their proper place in popular music history analyzing teenset across its five year publication span allison bumsted shows that the magazine is an important artifact of 1960s american popular culture through its critical commentary and iconic rock photography teenset engaged not only with musical genres and scenes but also broader social issues such as politics race and gender these countercultural discourses have been widely overlooked due to a generalization of teen fan magazines which have wrongly presumed the magazine to be antithetical to rock music and as unimportant to broader american culture at the time bumsted also examines the leadership of editor judith sims and female teenset staff writers such as carol gold by offering a counternarrative to leading male oriented narratives in music journalism she challenges current discourses that have marginalized women in popular music history ultimately the book illustrates that teenset and teen fan magazines were meaningful not only to readers but also to the broader development of the popular music press and 1960s cultural commentary

this book explores the soviet attempt to propagandise the new soviet woman through the magazines rabotnitsa and krest yanka from the 1920s to the end of the stalin era balancing work and family did not prove easy in a climate of shifting economic and demographic priorities and the book charts the periodic changes made to the model

in citizens of scandal vanessa freije explores the causes and consequences of political scandals in mexico from the 1960s through the 1980s tracing the process by which mexico city reporters denounced official wrongdoing she shows that by the 1980s political scandals were a

common feature of the national media diet news stories of state embezzlement torture police violence and electoral fraud provided collective opportunities to voice dissent and offered an important though unpredictable and inequitable mechanism for political representation the publicity of wrongdoing also disrupted top down attempts by the ruling partido revolucionario institucional to manage public discourse exposing divisions within the party and forcing government officials to grapple with popular discontent while critical reporters denounced corruption they also withheld many secrets from public discussion sometimes out of concern for their safety freije highlights the tensions between free speech and censorship representation and exclusion and transparency and secrecy that defined the mexican public sphere in the late twentieth century
