open secrets is richard lischer s story of his early career as a lutheran minister fresh out of divinity school and full of enthusiasm lischer found himself assigned to a small conservative church in an economically depressed town in southern illinois this was far from what this overly enthusiastic and optimistic young man expected the town was bleak poor and clearly not a step on his path to a brilliant career it s an awkward marriage at best a young man with a ph d in theology full of ideas and ambitions determined to improve his parish and bring them into the twenty first century and a community that is as tightly sealed as a jar of home canned pickles in their own way they welcome him and his family even though they think he s got bigger fish to fry thus begins richard lischer s first year as a pastor bringing communion to the sick but forgetting to bring the wafers marrying two unlikely couples a pregnant teenager and her boyfriend and two people who can t stop fighting often he doesn t understand his congregation and sometimes they don t understand him for instance why does his wife hire a baby sitter and instead of leaving put on her bathing suit grab a stack of novels and hide from the kids or why can t pastor lischer see how important it is for a woman with little money to buy an elaborate coffin to bury her husband in there are also the moments of grace when pastor and parishioner unite for a common goal when he asks for prayers for his infant son and can feel everyone in the congregation ministering to him when old hurts are put aside to help a desperate young woman finish college and raise her baby or when he helps save a woman from dying of a drug overdose in open secrets lischer tells not only his own story but also the story of new cana and all of its inhabitants lovable deeply flawed imperfect people that stick together with his sharp eye and keen wit lischer perfectly captures the comedy of small town life with all of its feuds rumors scandals and friendships in the end he learns to appreciate not only the life new cana has to offer but also the people who have accepted him at last as part of themselves

when sathnam sanghera was twenty four years old he discovered a secret about his father that would both darken and illuminate his life his father had been schizophrenic for almost all his adult life and in the early years of his marriage to sathnam s mother had been terrifyingly violent towards his family the discovery would set the author on a journey into his family s past from his father s harsh life in rural punjab to the terrifying early years of his parents marriage in england from his mother s extraordinary resilience as she brought up her young family in a foreign land without any knowledge of its language to the author s happy memories of his own childhood his obsessions with george michael and how to have the perfect top knot and most affectingly of all this discovery would finally force sanghera s own secret life into the glaring light his longing for romantic love which he had for fear of family rejection kept utterly hidden from his beloved

mother in the midlands

in the spirit of alison bechdel's *fun home* and roz chast's *can't we talk about something more pleasant* margaret kimball's *and now i spill the family secrets* begins in the aftermath of a tragedy in 1988 when kimball is only four years old her mother attempts suicide on mother's day and this becomes one of many things kimball's family never speaks about as she searches for answers nearly thirty years later kimball embarks on a thrilling visual journey into the secrets her family has kept for decades using old diary entries hospital records home videos and other archives margaret pieces together a narrative map of her childhood her mother's bipolar disorder her grandmother's institutionalization and her brother's increasing struggles in an attempt to understand what no one likes to talk about the fractures in her family both a coming of age story about family dysfunction and a reflection on mental health and now *i spill the family secrets* is funny poignant and deeply inspiring in its portrayal of what drives a family apart and what keeps them together

an insider's account of growing up with a schizophrenic mother and the disastrous toll the illness and her sicilian catholic family's code of secrecy takes upon her young life

gives an account of fourteen years of incestuous abuse by the author's father looking at how she dealt with her situation and how it affected her years after it stopped

bloodletting letting n 1 phlebotomy the act or process of letting blood or bleeding as by opening a vein or artery 2 outmoded medical practice used as a cure for illnesses ranging from fevers to hysteria bloodletting is a frank compelling and at times darkly humorous memoir boldly challenging the silence surrounding one of mental health's last taboos a close relative of bulimia and anorexia it is estimated that up to 1 per cent of the population has intentionally harmed itself yet for the most part it is a behaviour that goes unspoken dismissed as the attention seeking actions of prison inmates or delinquent teenagers if you had run into victoria on the street during her darkest days you would never have known the torment she endured confident polite and articulate she could have been your sister your workmate your friend your lover yet from her late teens and throughout her twenties victoria leatham struggled with the overwhelming desire to hurt herself a desire that was all consuming and shaped every aspect of her life and while not everyone who feels stressed insecure or depressed will physically turn upon themselves anyone who has ever felt out of control will recognise the logic that drove her today victoria is a happy successful 30 something professional who only occasionally glances sideways at the bathroom cabinet

how much do we really know about the lives of our parents and the secrets lodged in their past judy bolton fasman's fascinating saga asylum a memoir of family secrets recounts the search for answers to the mysteries embedded in the lives of her cuban born mother matilde alboukrek bolton and her elusive yale educated father k harold bolton in the prefatory chapter burn this judy receives a thick letter from her father and conjectures that the contents will reveal the long hidden explanations confessions and secrets that will unlock her father's cryptic past just as she is about to open the portal to her father's transtienas his dark hidden secrets harold bolton phones judy and instructs her to burn the still unopened letter with the flick of a match judy ignites her father's unread documents effectively destroying the answers to long held questions that surround her parents improbable marriage and their even more secretive lives judy bolton girl detective embarks on the life long exploration of her bifurcated ancestry judy inherits a sephardic spanish ladino speaking culture from her mother and an ashkenazi english only old fashioned american patriotism from her father amid the bolton household's cultural political and psychological confusion judy is mystified by her father's impenetrable silence and similarly confounded by her mother's fabrications not the least of which involve rumors of a dowry pay off and multiple wedding ceremonies for the oddly mismatched 40 year old groom and the 24 year old bride contacting former associates relatives and friends accessing records through the freedom of information act traveling to cuba to search for clues and even reciting the mourner's kaddish for a year to gain spiritual insight into her father these decades long endeavors do not always yield the answers judy wanted and sometimes the answers themselves lead her to ask new questions among asylum's most astonishing unsolved mysteries is ana hernandez's appearance at the family home on asylum avenue in west hartford connecticut ana is an exchange student from guatemala whom judy comes to presume to be her paternal half sister in seeking information about ana judy's investigations prove to be much like her entire enterprise both enticing and frustrating was ana just a misconstrued memory or is she a still living piece of the puzzle that judy has spent her adult life trying to solve readers will relish every step and stage of judy's investigations and will begin to share in her obsession to obtain answers to the mysteries that have haunted her life the suspense the clairvoyant prophecies the discoveries the new leads the dead ends the paths not taken all capture our attention in this absorbing and fascinating memoir

in this searing memoir iran born author rahimeh andalibian tells the story of her family their struggle to survive the 1979 revolution their move to california and their attempts to acculturate in the face of teenage rebellion murder addiction and new traditions andalibian struggles to make sense of two brutal crimes a rape solved by her father and a murder of which her beloved oldest brother stands accused she takes us first into her family's tranquil jasmine scented days of prosperity in their luxury hotel in mashhad iran their life is ruptured by the 1979 revolution as they flee first to the safety of a mansion in tehran next to a squalid one room flat in london and finally to california where they suffer a different kind of revolution struggling to adjust to a new host culture they soon discover that although they escaped iran they are not free from their own lies and hidden truths as the family comes to grips with their new home the strength of their bonds are tested by love loyalty compassion hate pain loss and the will to survive heartbreaking and intimately told this is a universal story of healing rebirth after tragedy and hard won redemption

the secret life of a schoolgirl is an extraordinary memoir a jewel rosemary kingsland was born in india during the dying days of the british raj while there she and her family lived a life of privilege but with the fall of the raj they were forced to return to england where their fortunes took a decided turn for the worse in london then in cornwall then back in london the simmering tension between rosemary's parents erupted into outright warfare fueled by alcohol and her father's persistent unrepentant womanizing it was a lonely dangerous childhood but one day rosemary's life changed forever at a café where she had gone to escape
