in the courtroom and the classroom in popular media public policy and scholarly pursuits the holocaust its origins its nature and its implications remains very much a matter of interest debate and controversy arriving at a time when a new generation must come to terms with the legacy of the holocaust or forever lose the benefit of its historical social and moral lessons this volume offers a richly varied deeply informed perspective on the practice interpretation and direction of holocaust research now and in the

future in their essays the authors an international group including eminent senior scholars as well those who represent the future of the field set the agenda for holocaust studies in the coming years even as they give readers the means for understanding today s news and views of the holocaust whether in court cases involving victims and perpetrators international national and corporate developments or fictional documentary and historical accounts several of the essays such as one on nonarmed amidah or resistance and others on the role of gender in the behavior of perpetrators and victims provide innovative and potentially significant interpretive frameworks for the field of holocaust studies others for instance the rounding up of jews in italy nazi food policy in eastern europe and nazi anti jewish scholarship emphasize the importance of new sources for reconstructing the historical record still others including essays on the 1964 frankfurt trial of auschwitz guards and on the response of the catholic church to the question of german guilt bring a new depth and sophistication to highly charged sharply politicized topics together these essays will inform the future of the holocaust in scholarly research and in popular understanding

this book uses an empathic reading of yiddish diarists feelings evaluations and assessments about persecutors in the warsaw lodz and vilna ghettos to present an emotional history of persecution in the nazi ghettos it re centers the daily experiences of psychological and physical violence that made up ghetto life and that ultimately led victims to use their diaries as a place of agency to question and attempt to maintain their own beliefs in pre war jewish and enlightenment ethics and morality holocaust scholars and students as well as people interested in personal narratives interpersonal relations and the problem of dehumanization during the holocaust will find this study particularly thought provoking essentially this book highlights the benefits of reading with empathy and paying attention to emotions for understanding the experiences of people in the past especially those facing tragedy and trauma

highlights the key decisions and events of world war ii in europe from allied and axis perspectives

groundbreaking study on the destruction of the jews of vilnius 1941 1944

published by the university of nebraska press lincoln and yad vashem jerusalem the holocaust in the soviet union is the most complete account to date of the soviet jews during the world war ii and the holocaust 1941 45 reports records documents and research previously unavailable in english enable yitzhak arad to trace the holocaust in the german occupied territories of the soviet union through three separate periods in which german political and military goals in the occupied territories dictated the treatment of the jews arad s examination of the differences between the holocaust in the soviet union compared to other european nations reveals how nazi ideological attacks on the soviet union which included war on judeo bolshevism led to harsher treatment of jews in the soviet union than in most other occupied territories this historical narrative presents a wealth of information from german russian and jewish archival sources that will be invaluable to scholars researchers and the general public for years to come

historians have mainly seen the ghettos established by the nazis in german occupied eastern europe as spaces marked by brutality tyranny and the systematic murder of the jewish population drawing on examples from the warsaw lodz and vilna ghettos dance on the razor s edge explores how in fact highly improvised legal spheres emerged in these coerced and heterogeneous ghetto communities looking at sources from multiple archives and countries svenja bethke investigates how the jewish councils set up on german orders and composed of ghetto inhabitants formulated new definitions of criminal offenses and established legal institutions on their own initiative as a desperate attempt to ensure the survival of the ghetto communities bethke explores how people under these circumstances tried to make sense of everyday lives that had been turned upside down bringing with them pre war notions of justice and morality and she considers the extent to which this rupture led to new judgments on human behaviour in doing so bethke aims to understand how people attempted to use their very limited scope for action in

order to survive set against the background of a holocaust historiography that often still seeks for clear categories of good and bad behaviours dance on the razor s edge calls for a new understanding of the ghettos as complex communities in an unprecedented emergency situation

a thrilling mystery woven into a beautifully constructed family memoir meryl frank s journey to seek the truth about a beloved and revolutionary cousin a celebrated actress in vilna before world war ii and to answer the question of how the next generation should honor the memory of the holocaust as a child meryl frank was the chosen inheritor of family remembrance her aunt mollie a formidable and cultured woman insisted that meryl never forget who they were where they came from and the hate that nearly destroyed them over long afternoons mollie told her about the city the theater and above all else meryl s cousin the radiant franya winter franya was the leading light of vilna s yiddish theater a remarkable and precocious woman who cast off the restrictions of her hasidic family and community to play roles as

prostitutes and bellhops lovers and nuns yet there was one thing her aunt mollie would never tell meryl how franya died before mollie passed away she gave meryl a yiddish book containing the terrible answer but forbade her to read it and for years meryl obeyed unearthed is the story of meryl s search for franya and a timely history of hatred and resistance through archives across four continents by way of chance encounters and miraculous discoveries and eventually guided by the shocking truth recorded in the pages of the forbidden book meryl conjures the rogue spirit of her cousin her beauty and her tragedy meryl s search reveals a lost world destroyed by hatred illuminating the cultural haven of vilna and its resistance during world war ii as she seeks to find her lost family legacy meryl looks for answers to the questions that have defined her life what is our duty to the past how do we honor such memories while keeping them from consuming us and what do we teach our children about tragedy

the fall of a sparrow is the only full biography in english of the partisan poet and patriot abba kovner 1918 1987 an unsung and largely unknown hero of the second world war and israel s war of independence kovner was born in vilna the jerusalem of lithuania long before the rest of the world suspected he was the first person to state that hitler was planning to kill the jews of europe kovner and other defenders of the vilna ghetto only hours before its destruction escaped to the forest to join the partisans fighting the nazis returning after the liberation to find vilna empty of jews he immigrated to israel where he devised a fruitless plot to take revenge on the germans he then joined the israeli army and served as the givati brigade s information officer writing battle notes newsletters that inspired the troops defending tel aviv after the war kovner settled on a kibbutz and dedicated his life to working the land writing poetry and raising a family he was also the moving force behind such projects as the diaspora museum and the institute for the translation of hebrew literature the fall of a sparrow is based on countless interviews with people who knew kovner and letters and archival material that have never been translated before

drawing on the best research produced over the last sixty years this collection brings together the most significant secondary literature on the nazi persecution and mass murder of the jews

this collection of essays was inspired by the desire to create a suitable tribute to dr irving greenberg dr greenberg has been one of the truly major figures in the american jewish community for the past forty years a community activist and a theologian of distinction he has influenced not only the practical direction of jewish life especially through his work with the leadership of jewish federations throughout the country but also the shape of contemporary jewish thought through his writings on the holocaust the state of israel and traditional jewish themes the outstanding list of authors who have contributed to this volume writing on central issues in traditional and modern jewish thought and history are a testimony to dr greenberg s repercussive presence and theological contribution those interested in the contemporary american jewish community and the nature and shape of modern jewish thought at the beginning of the new millennium will find this a valuable thought provoking addition to their libraries

unlike many holocaust books which deal primarily with the concentration camps this book focuses on jewish life before jews lost their autonomy and fell totally under nazi power these essays concern various aspects of jewish daily life and governance such as the judenrat the warsaw ghetto uprising religious life housing death smuggling art and the struggle for survival while under siege by the nazi regime written by survivors of the ghettos throughout poland czechoslovakia and hungary this collection contains historical and cultural articles by prominent scholars an essay on holocaust theatre and an article on teaching the holocaust to students

introduces the history of jewish holocaust and provides information on planning commemorative programs

the book is based on hundreds of oral histories conducted in europe and north america with survivors

who were children in the holocaust primary documentation uncovered by the author including diaries letters photographs and family albums and archival records drawing on these sources dwork reveals the feeling daily activities and perceptions of jewish children who lived and died in the shadow of holocaust she reconstructs and analyzes the many different experiences the children faced in the early years of nazi domination they lived at home increasingly oppressed by rising anti semitism later some went into hiding while others attempted to live openly on gentile papers as time passed more and more were forced into transit camps ghettos and death and slave labour camps although nearly 90 percent of the jewish children in nazi europe were murdered we learn in this history not of their deaths but of the circumstances of their lives

over 500 000 jews fought under the soviet banner in world war two of which an approximate 40 percent gave their lives the highest percentage of all the nations of the soviet union and among all the other nations that fought in the second world war dr arad now sets the record straight on the immense contribution of soviet jewry in the battle against nazi germany a part of history long concealed by the soviet government after outlining the military progress of the war the book documents the contributions of soviet jewry on the battlefronts and in the weapons development industry in the ghetto undergrounds and in partisan warfare in addition the book records the soviet government s deliberate attempts to downplay the jewish effort and the anti semitism that jewish soldiers and partisan groups suffered at the hands of the soviet establishment even while giving their lives for their country replete with the stories of individual heroes of all ranks the book pays a debt of gratitude to those who paid the ultimate price to achieve our victory

in music in the holocaust shirli gilbert provides the first large scale critical account of the role of music amongst communities imprisoned under nazism she documents a wide scope of musical activities ranging from orchestras and chamber groups to choirs theatres communal sing songs and cabarets in

some of the most important internment centres in nazi occupied europe including auschwitz and the warsaw and vilna ghettos gilbert is also concerned with exploring the ways in which music particularly the many songs that were preserved contribute to our broader understanding of the holocaust and the experiences of its victims music in the holocaust is at its core a social history taking as its focus the lives of individuals and communities imprisoned under nazism music opens a unique window on to the internal world of those communities offering insight into how they understood interpreted and responded to their experiences at the time

few lives shed more light on the complex relationship between jews and christians during and after the holocaust or provide a more moving portrait of courage than oswald rufeisen s a jew passing as a christian in occupied poland rufeisen worked as translator for the german police the very people who rounded up and murdered the jews and repeatedly risked his life to save hundreds from the nazis in this gripping biography nechama tec a widely acclaimed writer on the holocaust recounts rufeisen s remarkable story a youth of seventeen when world war ii began rufeisen joined the exodus of poles who fled the approaching german army tec vividly describes how rufeisen used his ability to speak fluent german to pass as half german and half polish in mir where he came to serve as translator and personal secretary to the german in charge of the gendarmerie as he carried out his duties reading death sentences to prisoners swearing in new police officers before a portrait of hitler he earned the trust and affection of the german commander yet lived in constant fear of discovery he used his position to pass secret information to jews and christians about impending aktions and to sabatoge nazi plans most notably he thwarted the annihilation of the mir ghetto by arming hundreds of doomed jews and organizing their escape and saved an entire belorussian village from destruction denounced rufeisen escaped and found shelter in a convent where he converted to catholicism though a pacifist he spent the rest of the war fighting in a russian partisan unit after the war father daniel as he is now known became a priest and a

carmelite monk identifying himself as a christian jew and an ardent zionist he moved to israel where he challenged the law of return in a case that reached the high court and attracted international attention today he continues to devote himself to bridging the gap between christians and jews in the lion s den offers a stirring portrait of a jewish rescuer during the holocaust and its aftermath illuminating the intricate connections between good and evil cruelty and compassion and judaism and christianity

a powerful tale of the triumph of love under extremely difficult conditions tells the story of a married couple who were part of the jewish resistance publishers weekly at his father s funeral one of the mourners told michael bart that the gravestone should include a reference to the freedom fighters of nekamah to honor leizer bart s involvement in the jewish resistance movement in vilna now vilnius lithuania at the end of world war ii michael had never heard his parents referenced as freedom fighters michael embarked on a ten year research project to find out more details about his parents time in the vilna ghetto where they met fell in love and married and about their activities as members of the jewish resistance until our last breath is the culmination of his research and his parents story of love and survival zenia bart s mother was born and raised in vilna leizer fled there to escape the nazi invasion of his hometown of hrubieshov in poland they were married by one of the last remaining rabbis ninety days before the liquidation of the ghetto zenia and leizer along with about 120 members of the vilna ghetto underground escaped to the rudnicki forest they became part of the jewish partisan fighting group led by abba kovner known as the avengers which carried out sabotage missions against the nazi army and eventually participated in the liberation of vilna until our last breath is intensely personal and painstakingly researched a lasting memorial to the jews of vilna a work of exceptional historical importance booklist appeals equally to the head and the heart kirkus reviews

once regarded as a vibrant centre of intellectual cultural and spiritual jewish life lithuania was home to 240 000 jews prior to the nazi invasion of 1941 by war s end less than 20 000 remained today

approximately 4 000 jews reside there among them 108 survivors from the camps and ghettos and a further 70 from the partisans and red army against a backdrop of ongoing holocaust dismissal and a recent surge in anti semitic sentiment holocaust legacy in post soviet lithuania presents the history and experiences of a group of elderly holocaust survivors in modern day vilnius using their stories and memories their places of significance as well as biographical objects shivaun woolfson considers the complexities surrounding holocaust memory and legacy in a post soviet era lithuania the book also incorporates interdisciplinary elements of anthropology psychology and ethnography and is informed at its heart by a spiritual approach that marks it out from other more conventional historical treatments of the subject holocaust legacy in post soviet lithuania includes 20 images comes with comprehensive online resources and weaves together story artefact monument and landscape to provide a multidimensional history of the lithuanian jewish experience during and after the holocaust

a comprehensive survey of the most important writing to come out of the holocaust writing in witness is a broad survey of the most important writing about the holocaust produced by eyewitnesses at the time and soon after whether they intended to spark resistance and undermine nazi authority to comfort family and community to beseech god or to leave a memorial record for posterity the writers reflect on the power and limitations of the written word in the face of events often thought to be beyond representation the diaries journals letters poems and other works were created across a geography reaching from the baltics to the balkans from the atlantic coast to the heart of the soviet union and in a wide array of original languages along with the readings eric j sundquist s introductions provide a comprehensive account of the holocaust as a historical event including works by prominent authors such as primo levi and elie wiesel as well as those little known or anonymous writing in witness provides in vital and memorable examples a wide ranging account of the holocaust by those who felt the imperative to give written testimony written in every european language in every conceivable manner and from

this four volume set provides reference entries primary documents and personal accounts from individuals who lived through the holocaust that allow readers to better understand the cultural political and economic motivations that spurred the final solution the holocaust that occurred during world war ii remains one of the deadliest genocides in human history with an estimated two thirds of the 9 million jews in europe at the time being killed as a result of the policies of adolf hitler and nazi germany the holocaust an encyclopedia and document collection provides students with an all encompassing resource for learning about this tragic event a four book collection that provides detailed information as well as multidisciplinary perspectives that will serve as a gateway to meaningful discussion and further research the first two volumes present reference entries on significant individuals of the holocaust both victims and perpetrators anti semitic ideology and annihilationist policies advocated by the nazi regime giving readers insight into the social political cultural military and economic aspects of the holocaust while enabling them to better understand the final solution in europe during world war ii and its lasting legacy the third volume of the set presents memoirs and personal narratives that describe in their own words the experiences of survivors and resistors who lived through the chaos and horror of the final solution the last volume consists of primary documents including government decrees and military orders propaganda in the form of newspapers and pamphlets war crime trial transcripts and other items that provide a direct look at the causes and consequences of the holocaust under the nazi regime by

examining these primary sources users can have a deeper understanding of the ideas and policies used by perpetrators to justify their actions in the annihilation of the jews of europe the set not only provides an invaluable and comprehensive research tool on the holocaust but also offers historical perspective and examination of the origins of the discontent and cultural resentment that resulted in the holocaust subject matter that remains highly relevant to key problems facing human society in the 21st century and beyond
