missio dei by its very nature requires the church to come to terms with the exercise of power both internally and externally as it confronts the world tune in to any newscast or glance at the daily newspaper and it immediately becomes clear that the use and abuse of power is a live issue the more we focus on the twists and turns of current events the more it appears that uncorrupted exercise of power eludes the human race all too often we become uneasily aware that there are powers lying behind the power that any of us wields whether it is in the family the classroom on the shop floor in the boardroom or in churches effective missional

leadership involves creative engagement with the powers at work in the world without being debased by them this book sets out to address the issue of the use and misuse of power from biblical theological and practical perspectives the authors bring their theological pastoral missionary and personal experience to their task in order to inform challenge and invite readers into a responsible use of the powers that god has put into the hands of each one of us to achieve his purposes in the world

mainline christianity in the west is dying addiction to hierarchical and bureaucratic power is killing it a management god and a mission god have usurped the way of christ in the midst of decline the missional movement is attempting to reboot the church its goal is to remake a new christian west through mission leadership mapping and planning yet it is trapped in the language and methods of modernity its final solution is a polarizing vision of cultural domination by one social group the christians the way of life and truth has been forgotten christ is not a conquering king a written word or an absolute idea but a divine human being social wholeness can only be realized through a rediscovery of conversation reconciliation and empowerment these reflect christs practices of eternal dialogue and reciprocal giving in small communities through this mutual way of life people of all faiths and none can discover deep within themselves our un known g d a gentle voice is whispering in the heart of all humanity i am the way

does your church look and sound and feel like mission mission happens when congregations fully align themselves with god s purposes as the missional church movement matures anabaptists bring a time honored theological tradition a contemporary spiritual vitality and practical stories of witness to the conversation how are churches and individuals living out christ s call to engage locally and globally and how is it changing them in the process featuring the voices of missional mennonite leaders fully engaged offers stories and analysis about how mission is taking shape in local congregations and contexts a diverse chorus of anabaptist pastors and laypeople explores the roots tools and applications of the missional movement from nurturing church planting to creating a missional culture to preaching for missional engagement fully engaged offers insights and ideas for churches looking for direction

the mission church literature seems to be dominated by idealized conceptions of the benefits of equipping congregations to participate in local mission work this investigation challenges this idealism by paying critical attention to congregants ordinary theologies that develop in reaction to the communication of missio dei theology to them their voices are absent from the formal literature the study employs rescripting methodology to modify key assumptions made in the formal ecclesiological literature by drawing on insights that come from christians ordinary theological voices the study traces how the introduction of a missio dei theology

to a british reformed congregation had a significant impact on them a small team of christian leaders communicated missio dei theology to this church over a period of six years it found that mission changes came at substantial personal cost to the church's members 1 a schism occurred when congregants attempted to remove the leader responsible for these changes from his office as church pastor and a third of congregants left the church because they did not want to embrace the church's new mission identity 2 three divergent groups then emerged two of them wanted different kinds of churches that seemed incompatible 3 two thirds of members supported and participated in the church's mission activities which put strains on some of their families 4 unresolved tensions continued to impact the congregation throughout the whole change process 5 unexpectedly for a reformed church a third group made up of women developed prophetic practices that arose due to the mediation of missio dei theology vitally this thesis challenges the notion that helping churches to become mission focused will make them thrive

too often the solution sought by many struggling churches is to make the homerun hire to find the charismatic leader who will take them to the promised land of growth and vibrant ministry while this strategy occasionally pays off it has overwhelmingly failed as seen in the hundreds of churches across the united states that close their doors annually is it possible that there is another way forward for those seeking to lead local congregations into missionally vibrant ministry especially those located in multiethnic urban areas in charismatic leadership and missional change one church s journey from a struggling primarily anglo congregation of less than 100 members to becoming a missionally vibrant multiethnic church of more than 700 attendees with no clear ethnic majority documented the charismatic leadership style that drove this change is discussed and critiqued as well as the adaptive challenges that have arisen in the church because of it an alternative approach interpretive leadership is proposed as a different pathway forward in response to these challenges the result the author suggests will be to empower the diverse everyday people of god to participate in god s mission in exciting and surprising new ways

what does it mean to be a small missional community in a deeply secularized society drawing on a wide range of practical insight with mission in one of the most secular contexts of the west pilgrims and priests blends this experience with a thorough analysis of relevant biblical historical sociological theological and spiritual sources that bear relevance to missional identity in the challenging circumstances presented by the secular west it presents a hopeful perspective rooted in a realistic appraisal of reality and rich theological reflections the result is an important resource for thinkers practitioners and all who are fascinated by the future of christianity in the west

the old structures of the church are broken but what should we do about it some try to keep the structures in place by making small adaptations while others try to dispense with them altogether alan roxburgh calls us to see the underlying narratives that make structures necessary and to experiment with new ways of being the local church in a changing world

servantship is essentially about following our lord jesus christ the servant lord and his mission it is a life of discipleship to him patterned after his self emptying humility sacrifice love values and mission servantship is humbly valuing others more than yourself and looking out for the interests and wellbeing of others servantship is the cultivation of the same attitude of mind christ jesus had making yourself nothing being a servant humbling yourself and submitting yourself to the will and purposes of the triune god since servantship is the imitation of christ it involves an unreserved participation in the missio dei the trinitarian mission of god in this pioneering work sixteen servants describe the four movements of radical servantship servantship is the movement 1 from leadership to radical servantship 2 from shallowness to dynamic theological reflection 3 from theories to courageous practices and 4 from forgetfulness to transforming memory servantship recognizes in word thought and deed that whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant and whoever wants to be first must be your slave just as the son of man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many
